I have just signed the contract for our reunion in Savannah Georgia. The reunion will be held at the Marriott Savannah Riverfront from August 22 to August 26, 2007. Many of you may be surprised by the dates. In the past, our reunions were held during the last week of July, however this was changed by popular vote last year in San Antonio. It was agreed that the reunion dates would be flexible to allow for seasonal weather, or better hotel rates. During our hotel search, reunion chairman Wallace Shaw informed me that hotels in Savannah are expensive. The cost of hotels rooms during the spring or fall was prohibitive. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Lee Bourne, Bert Creed, Jeremiah Perdie – these three friends died this past two years. Each was a dedicated Marine, a proven leader, a combat vet decorated for valor, and wounded in Vietnam.

Col Bourne and GySgt Perdie served in Korea and Vietnam. I first met the Colonel when he was hospitalized with a heart attack in 1975, and watched him caring for other ill Marines that needed assistance. I had the privilege of visiting him a few months before his death, and, weak as he was, he wanted to talk about his Marines! SSgt Creed had earned the honor of becoming a DI at PI before he was medically retired. He and Angela were our gracious hosts during our first Savannah reunion.

GySgt Perdie, wounded three times with 3/4, was decorated for his role in the assault on Hill 484. The photo of him on the hill has become one of the vivid and best known from the war. Many guys in 3/4 remembered him from ITR at Camp Geiger (Lejeune) where he taught them tactics for assaulting an enemy machine gunner. After leaving 3/4, he remained in Okinawa for another year where he was instrumental in encouraging for 5,000 Marines to donate blood for use in Vietnam. He retired in 1969 and became a key leader in his church. I enjoyed visiting him at Fort Bragg, NC the year before he died. He held a group of Army Chaplains in awe that evening with his war stories from 3/4 and his spiritual enthusiasm.

In thankfulness for the honor of service and friendship with them, and for their service to Country and the Corps, with sadness and a salute, we will add their dog tags to our Association memorial in Savannah.

Our sets of dog tags, provided by MCRD San Diego and presented at our past reunion, for every man from 3/4 that was KIA in Vietnam could be the start of a perpetual memorial for the Association. Each reunion we may add tags for those known to have died previously or between reunions. Some helpfully pointed out that several names were omitted from our list. It would be helpful to know those names, and others from the Battalion that have died since Vietnam. If you have such information, contact Chaplain Beach at (352) 365-2406 or stanbeach@aol.com.

Letter From Brian Murphy

Hi Marines & Corpsmen of 3/4

Last week I was contacted by the uncle of Derek Reilly, a 13 yr old 8th grader at the Hollis Middle School in Hollis, New Hampshire. He and over 200 other classmates are in Washington and were hoping to learn about someone whose name is on the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial. They visit the wall Friday morning. None of the kids in Derek's homeroom class had a parent who could name someone KIA in Vietnam. Derek appealed to his uncle who lived in Norwood but was serving in Vietnam when he was notified that my brother L/Cpl Dick Murphy M Co 3/4 was KIA June 15, 1968.

I cooperated with their project and provided a lot of information for Ms. Patty Pallies class. I also included what I knew of PFC Jeffrey Thibault, James "Doc" Cruse, William Ivan "Doc" Mercer, and PFC Robert Lopez who I believe were all felled by the same sniper.

So a handful of Mike Co's fallen will get a visit from some kids learning about Vietnam and so much more. They'll be leaving memorials I'm told.

I thought you'd like to know. Below is a letter I sent to the kids to thank them, to tell them to look for others besides Dick, and to give them the perspective of someone about their age when their big brother was killed in battle.

Hi Derek and Friends,

First let me thank you for taking the interest in the men whose names are on the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial in Washington. There are eight women on there too. For those of us that were close to someone who gave their lives in Vietnam its comforting to know that our loved one is remembered and honored as they will be when you visit the wall on Friday.

My big brother Dick was typical of kids his generation. He loved girls, cards, and rock and roll. He loved sports, and music, and girls. He loved the Red Sox, and the Beatles, and girls. You see where I'm going here? He went to school. He went to church. He did chores around the house. He had a paper route back when kids delivered newspapers. Later, he worked in a super market, at a soda fountain, and in a warehouse. He lifted weights. He played trumpet. He played football.

He was a lot like you, all of you. If he was different in anyway, perhaps it is that he was keenly aware of how lucky he was to live when he did and where he did. He knew he was lucky to live in America in a large family in a house that may have never been spotless or quiet but we were all healthy, well fed, and got along pretty well.

As he got older and developed as a big brother and protector, it is no wonder he felt the call to serve his country. We had entered the war with noble intent – to stop the spread of Communism and to enable those in South Vietnam to determine for themselves how they would be governed. Vietnam is still a hot topic and a lot of people will tell you different things. I only suggest that someday you study war and make up your own mind. In any event, young Americans were fighting and dieing in Vietnam and Dick and many more volunteered to serve. Many were drafted to serve as well. Dick chose the Marine Corps and developed his body and mind for the task ahead.

When Dick left for Vietnam, I was ten. I had never heard of Vietnam. I couldn't find it on a map or globe. I never considered that he wouldn't be back. Any of you that have lost someone you love will understand that you want to make sure that your loved one isn't forgotten, and that they were important, and that their death was for a reason. For each name that you see on the wall – please understand that someone, somewhere, thinks of that person every day. Fifty-eight thousand families went through similar experiences to ours. To me, Dick will always be twenty. Thanks for giving him some attention.

You will find his name as Richard B. Murphy on Panel 57 west line 29, second name from the right. Under his name a couple of rows is Jeffrey Thibault who was from New Jersey and had only been in Vietnam about a month. Jeff loved cars and hung with friends at a favorite diner. He joined the Marines with a buddy but they got split up after boot camp. A close friend, in Vietnam at the time, accompanied his body home.

Just to the left Dick's name is William Ivan Mercer. He was called "Doc" as all Navy corpsmen are called. The Marines use Navy corpsmen as medics. They depend on them to keep them healthy and to save them when they are wounded. "Doc" Mercer was killed trying to get to my brother. He had recently been married and I somehow know that he loved to surf.

A few lines above them is James Dale Cruse. He was a navy corpsman too. He was from Paducah, Kentucky. He had already done his service in Vietnam when he volunteered to become a Corpsman and serve with the Marines. He was doing that for three months when he was killed. He was trying to get to the Marines mentioned above but first the sniper had to be taken care of. He was killed while preparing to throw a grenade at the sniper. Doc Cruse impressed everyone that he would have made a good Marine, but he was very good as a Corpsman and he was needed in that capacity. Mercer and Cruse were both awarded the Navy Cross for their sacrifice that day.

I think the other Marine that was killed right there and then was Robert Lopez whose name is a few names to the left of Dick's. I think he was the radioman that was killed by the same sniper. He had just been in Vietnam for three weeks. He was from Phoenix Arizona. For every name you see on the wall there is a hometown and a family that was rocked by their death. There are 217 men from New Hampshire on the wall. For each name on the wall there are countless more that were wounded in body and many more wounded in spirit. A great many lives were altered.

As I got to be older a lot of people would tell me that Vietnam was a waste, and that my brother died for nothing. I don't believe it. True it was a horrible loss, but I don't believe he died in vain. When you look at the overall picture; and we can do that now almost forty years later, Vietnam was a "hot" battle in the cold war. The Korean War was another example of the fight to keep Communism from spreading. When the Berlin Wall was town down in 1989 I realized that my brothers sacrifice had a part in the fall of communism. I am happy to say that I have found that my brother and others killed that day are remembered by those that survived the battles with them and those back home. We understand that Freedom Isn't Free.

Keep this in mind on Veteran's Day in November, Memorial Day in May, or even Flag Day in June. Keep this in mind when thinking of your grandfather that served in WWII or Korea or Vietnam, or your big brothers and sisters or cousin serving our country now.

I hope you have a great time!
